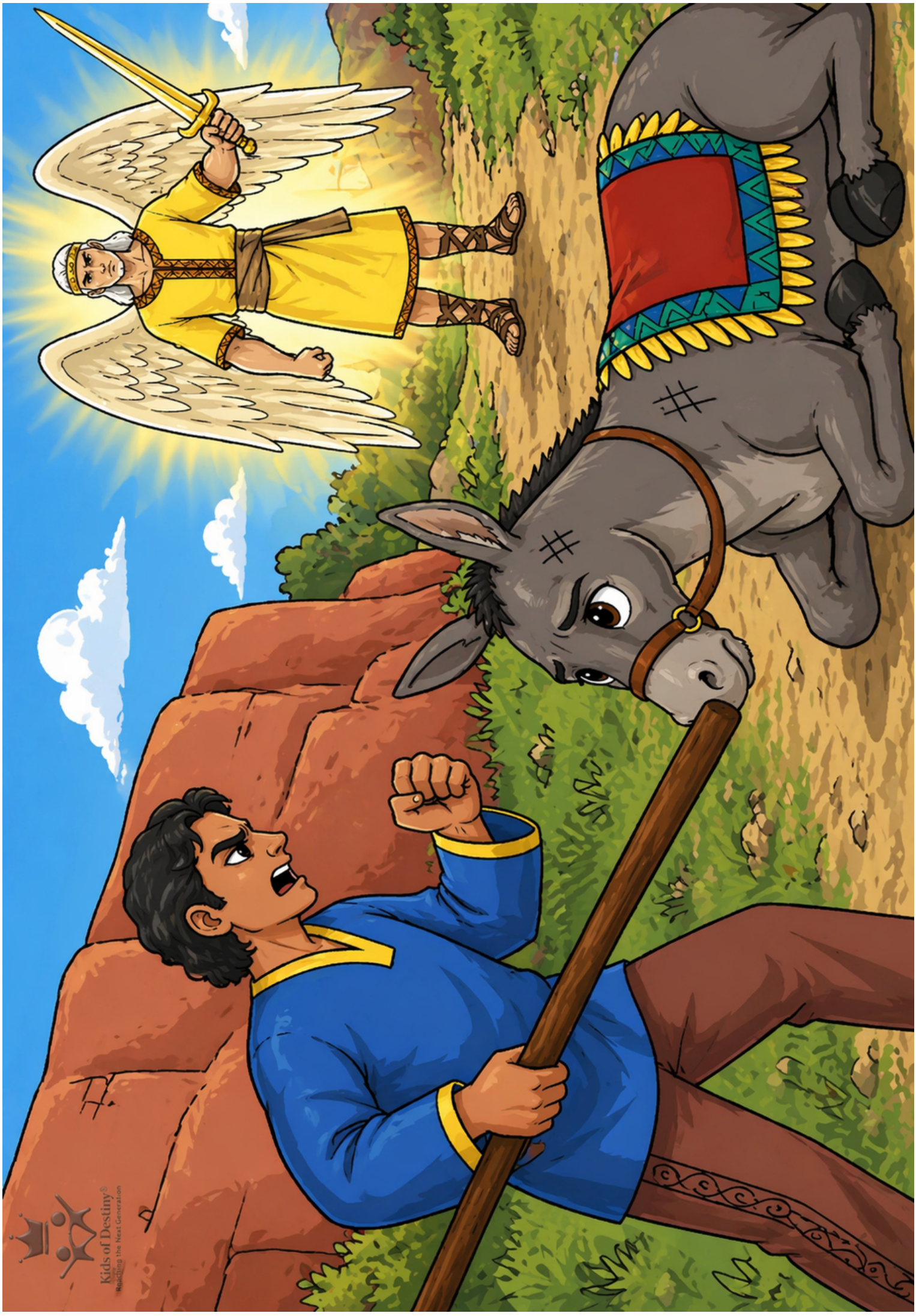

3.04 BALAAM AND HIS TALKING DONKEY

NUMBERS 22-24

Moses was leading the Israelites, God's people, to the land God had promised them—the land of Canaan. As they got closer to Canaan, there were many towns they needed to go through on the way. Most of these towns would not let them pass through. Sometimes there was even a battle between the Israelites and the people of these different areas. God wanted the Israelites to get to the promised land. God would help the Israelites win the battles.

One day, Moses and the Israelites were camped close to the town of Jericho, in the land of Moab. Balak, the king of Moab, was afraid of the Israelites. He had heard the stories of how they had won battles in other parts of the land. King Balak sent his messengers to get Balaam, a magician who lived in another town. The king heard that Balaam had great success with blessings and curses. He would have Balaam put a curse the Israelites! The messengers went to get Balaam.

Balaam listened to the messengers' request from the king. The message said, "A great crowd of people are coming from Egypt to destroy our land. Come and curse these people, so that I may win the battle." Balaam said he would ask God to direct his decision. God told Balaam not to go with these men. Balaam was not to curse God's people, the Israelites.

King Balak decided to send even more important officials to Balaam. Once again, Balaam was asked to come visit the king and put a curse on the Israelites. The king offered to pay him a good amount of money. Balaam told the officials that even if the king gave him his palace filled with silver and gold, he still would be powerless against what God told him. God spoke to Balaam. NUMBERS 22-24

HIGHLIGHTS:

- 1) The Israelites were camping near the town of Jericho, in the land of Moab. They had to fight battles on their way to Canaan, the land God promised them.
- 2) King Balak, the king of Moab, was afraid of the Israelites. They had won many battles. He sent for a magician named Balaam to come put a curse on them.
- 3) King Balak's messengers went to the town where Balaam lived and asked him to come back with them. Balaam told them God spoke to him and told him not to go with them. Then, the king sent more officials to ask Balaam again about coming to see the king and putting a curse on the Israelites. Although Balaam refused once again, God spoke to him that night telling Balaam that he could go with them.
- 4) When Balaam had been traveling for a while, an angel appeared on the road. Only Balaam's donkey could see the angel. First, the donkey ran into a field. Balaam beat his donkey. Two more times, the angel caused the donkey to keep Balaam from going down the road. Balaam got very angry and beat the donkey each time.
- 5) The donkey began to speak and ask Balaam why he was beating him. Then, Balaam saw the angel in front of them. He fell down and said he had sinned—that he would do whatever the angel told him to do.
- 6) The angel told him to go see the king, but to do only as he was told by God. When the king asked Balaam to curse the Israelites, Balaam told him he could only bless them, not curse them.

- 7) What did Balaam tell King Barak when he saw him?

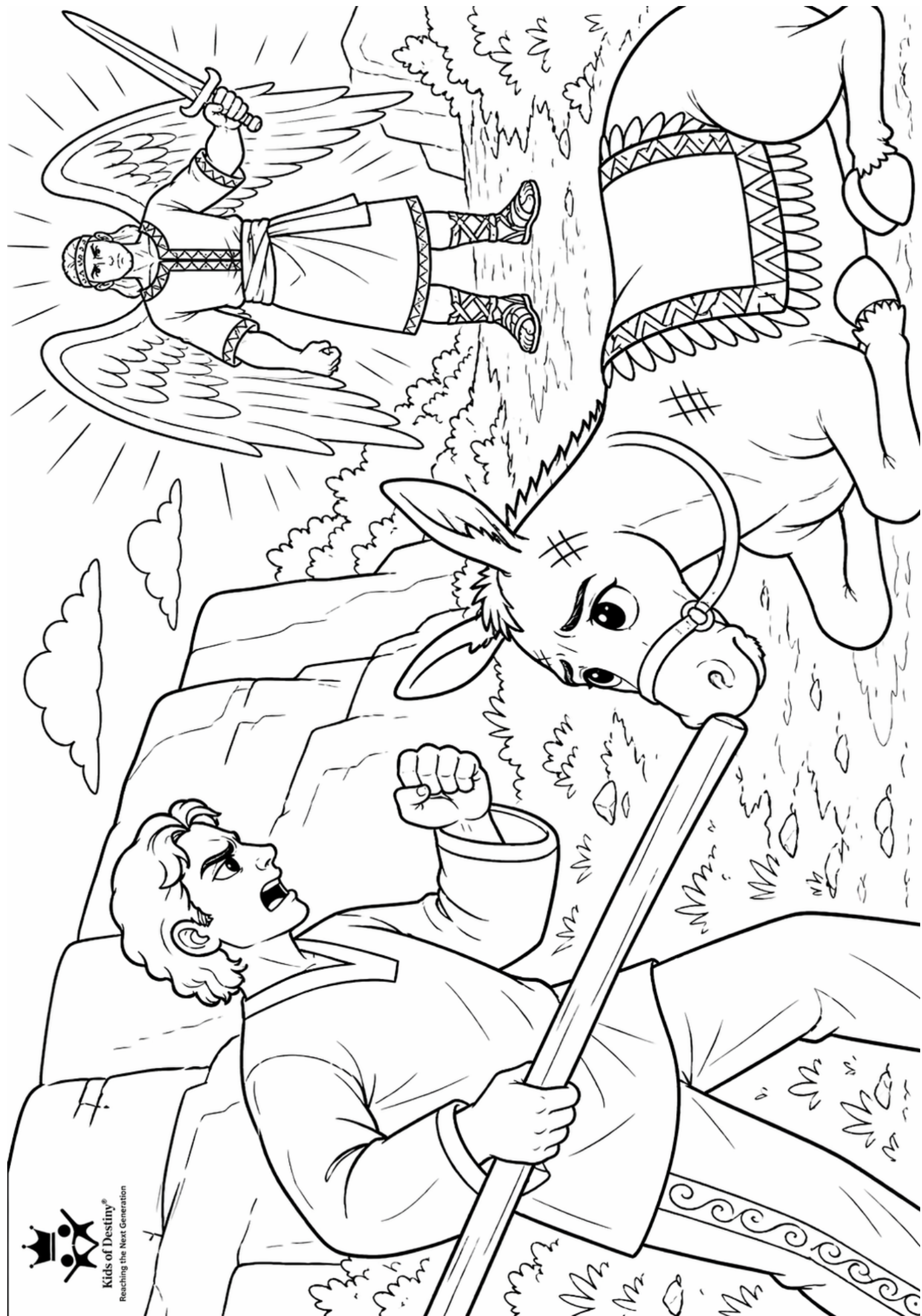
ANSWERS:

- 1) King Barak was the king of Moab.
- 2) King Barak was afraid of the Israelites. They had won many battles.
- 3) God told Balaam not to go back with the king's messengers.
- 4) The donkey ran into a field. Balaam beat him.
- 5) After Balaam beat his donkey three times, the donkey spoke to him. Then, Balaam saw the angel.
- 6) The angel told Balaam to only do as he was told by God.
- 7) Balaam told King Barak he could only bless the Israelites, not curse them.

Balak wanted Balaam to curse God's people, but God would not allow it. God warned Balaam through his donkey and through an angel. Balaam learned that he could only speak what God told him to say. God's people were blessed, and no one could curse what God had blessed.
